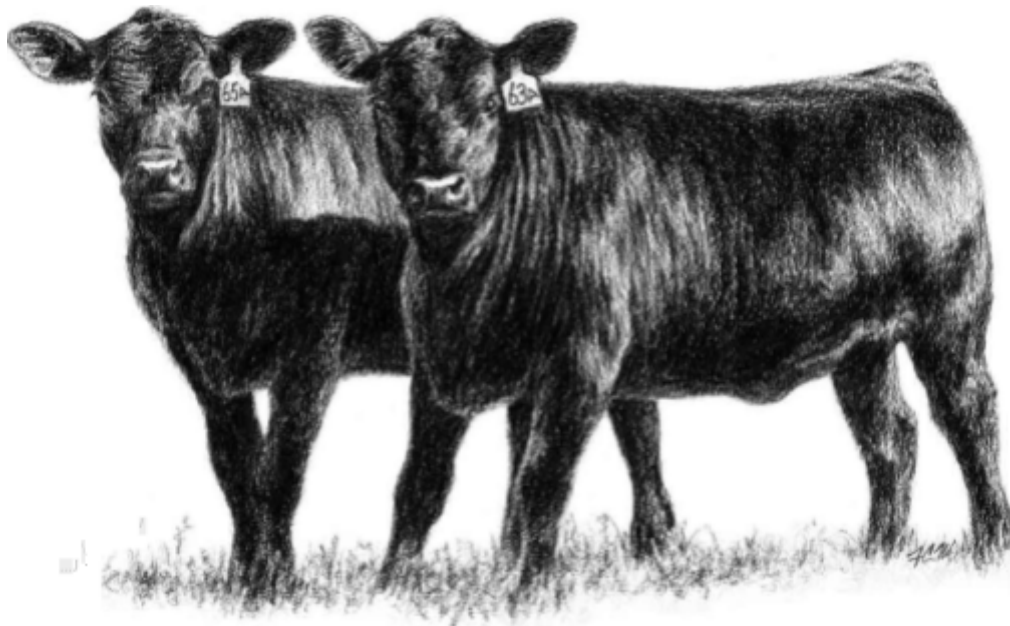

PROJECT INVENTORY (ASSETS): (Make copies if additional space is needed).

NON- FEED EXPENSES:
