*Each year it is the desire of the Polk County Cattlewomen's Association to award one or more scholarships based on available funding, qualifications and need of applicants. These scholarships may be of various amounts and evaluated for annual renewal based on the student's educational progress. The scholarship is scheduled to commence in the fall following the student's graduation from high school and is to be used in consecutive years, if renewable. Checks are issued directly to the registrar's office, one payment per semester, upon receipt of proof of enrollment in a college or technical training program.*

This application may be used for any of the scholarships which are available through the Polk County Cattlewomen's Association for graduating seniors enrolled in Polk County, FL public and private high schools or home education program. Preference will be given to students who have excelled in the promotion and production of the beef cattle industry during their high school years.

**2019 Polk County Cattlewomen's Academic Scholarship** - \$2,000.00 Total, payable in (4) \$500.00 payments (one payment per semester), paid directly to your enrolled school's registrar office. The recipient of this scholarship will be an individual who has a minimum of a 3.2 Cumulative High School GPA. You will be required to maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 while in college. Preference will be given to students who have excelled in the promotion and production of the beef cattle industry during their high school years.

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## Scholarship Eligibility and Requirements:

- *Graduating Polk County, FL seniors enrolled in a post secondary institution in Fall 2019. Provide proof of enrollment to the Polk County Cattlewomen's Association by August 15, 2019.*
- *You are required to provide a copy of your high school transcript when submitting this scholarship application.*
- *Must take a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester and successfully complete 24 credit hours per year.*
- *You will be required to show a copy of your college grades (a print-out showing grades and credit hours earned for the past semester that includes your name, school name and student identification) before your next scholarship payment is paid to your school's registrar office.*
- *Under special circumstances, a student may request a deferment to maintain the scholarship. A deferment period cannot be extended for more than 2 semesters unless unusual circumstances exist. Such requests will be reviewed and granted by the Polk County Cattlewomen's Scholarship Committee.*
